### *Singing into Grace*

*But be filled with the Spirit, as you sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making melody to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks to God at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.*  
-- Ephesians 5:18c-20

*Amazing grace, how sweet the sound.* There is much grace to be found in singing the old familiar hymns as we often do in our Sunday worship services and also in sharing the stories of our week with one another. We learn during our sharing of "joys, moments of grace, and concerns" each Sunday about times of happiness and excitement, sorrow and loss, anxiety and hope, that are happening in the lives of our neighbors in the pews. Sometimes we learn of exciting challenges and sometimes everyday happenings that for some reason or another just seem special and in need of telling. Our singing of hymns puts to music the emotions and deep movement of the Spirit that echoes in our sharing of our lives with one another.

Recently the Men's Discussion Group (MDG) had as their subject "music and the arts." Unfortunately, I had a schedule conflict that night and missed the discussion, but I wanted to share with you in this space what I probably would have shared with the MDG. I also wanted to share with you

some of my thoughts about why we do what we do in worship on Sunday mornings.

I'm often moved to ask the congregation to sing the old familiar hymns—*A Mighty Fortress is Our God*; *Precious Lord, Take My Hand*; and *Amazing Grace*. As it turns out, it seems that singing those well-worn phrases and melodies provide for us on Sunday mornings, as one week has finished and a new one is about to begin, some very needed balm for our hearts and minds. There is a sense that singing these old hymns (and some new ones, too!) enters into our bones and knits us together in common praise of God's presence within our community. Sometimes a feeling of peace descends upon us filling us with the Spirit that comforts and restores. Some people have told me that singing songs like *Amazing Grace* reminds them of a special people who long ago passed away, but who were blessings to them in their lives during especially difficult times. Others speak of hymns that remind them of particular times of joy or sorrow in their lives and what they were able to take away from those experiences that changed their lives.

Fred Buechner says about chanting [or singing] that "the prose becomes poetry [and] the prosaic becomes powerful." Through the ordinary singing together of hymns in our regular worship services we can experience the loving embrace of God and often get the needed consolation, challenge, or hope we all need. Please feel free anytime to suggest hymns to John or me that you would like to sing on Sunday mornings. The rhythms and melodies of our lives help keep the body of Christ vital, nourished and alive. A few days ago, in a package containing birthday presents for the girls along with a few quality hand me downs from their older cousins, my sister Sherri dropped a copy of a daily meditation with no note of explanation. On May 14, last month, a "Joint Venture Service" was scheduled to honor & thank Sunday school teachers and mothers (Mother's Day), to present Bibles to our 5th graders, celebrate with our youth and with each other (UCC & ECA.) What a loss to me if I had let past memories keep me from taking a fresh look at a Joint Venture Sunday Service.

In the early 80's the JV Sunday services I attended felt like business meetings. All the JV representatives were introduced and thanked. Numerous litanies were recited as to what had happened, was happening, and would be happening. Oh, there were prayers and scriptures, but somehow they were lost and disjointed in my mind as I sat "in the board room."

Somewhere in the 90's I remember an attempt to do something about the disjointedness by alternating whose service would serve as the basis for the "Joint Venture Sunday." Well, perhaps, for some that worked well! For me personally, it simply meant every other year I would attend the service.

At the turn of our century I found the Joint Venture Services, which highlighted milestones in the church year, Maundy Thursday, as one example, to be extremely worthwhile and meaningful to attend.


